

Parent and Family Engagement Plan

Washington Parish School System PAFE Plan

Statute: Section 1116(a)(2)ESEA states that each LEA must establish the LEA's expectations for parent and family engagement.

The **Washington Parish School Board** will be governed by the following statutory definition of parent and family engagement, and expects that its Title I schools **will carry out programs, activities, and procedures** in accordance with this definition: Parent and family engagement means the participation of parents in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring—

- (A) that parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning;
- (B) that parents are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school;
- (C) that parents are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child; and
- (D) the carrying out of other activities, such as those described in section 1116 of the ESEA.

<p>Feedback Mechanisms <i>(create channels for families to provide feedback on programs and policies)</i></p>	<p>-Superintendent’s Advisory Council is made up of 45 stakeholders from each aspect of the district & community. This committee meets to discuss programs, policies, and practices in the school district. -Lattes with Leadership meetings are held to give stakeholders an opportunity to discuss hot topics with district leadership. -School & district level surveys are sent out to parents and community stakeholders to measure school & district performance and to solicit input on policies & procedures.</p>	<p>-Advisory Council meets in August, January & May. -Lattes with Leadership meets in September, November, February & April. -General surveys are sent at least once per year. -Policy specific surveys (ie Pupil Progression, Code of Conduct, etc) are sent during revision process each year.</p>
